1. Take them on a trip around the world

If your loved one had a passion for travelling, you could take their ashes on a trip around the world and scatter them in each country that you visit. It may be that the deceased wanted to visit a specific city before they passed away but didn't get the chance; this could be a great place to lay their ashes to rest.

2. Turn them into jewellery

Memorial jewellery can be a wonderful way to feel close to a loved one again. Whether you choose a necklace, bracelet or ring, you will only need a tiny amount of your loved one's ashes to create a beautiful keepsake.

3. Scatter them at sea

Scattering a loved one's ashes at sea can be a great send off, especially if they loved spending time at the beach or if they were a boating enthusiast. Most beaches and coastlines in the UK are accessible to the public and, unlike burial at sea, you do not require a license.

8. Plant them as a tree

As green funerals and woodland burials continue to grow in popularity, you may wish to consider transforming your loved one's ashes into a tree. By planting a biodegradable urn, you will be able to grow a tree using cremated remains; it's the perfect way to say farewell to a loved one if they were passionate about the environment.

9. Release them with doves

Releasing doves after you have scattered a loved one's ashes can be a simple but poignant way to say goodbye. There are a number of companies in the UK which offer this unique service and you may even want to write a personal message which the doves will carry after being released.

10. Jump out of a plane with them
