Choosing a coffin, casket or urn

This brochure is designed to help you choose a coffin, casket or urn and we are here to help you with your decision. You will see from the descriptions, that some coffins may not be suitable for cremation, because of the material and local regulations at the crematorium. We also offer a limited range of designs suitable for children and we can help and advise you on this.

Some things to consider:

Including Personal Items

You may want to place personal items in the coffin, for example photographs, letters, cards, medals or flowers. If you have chosen a cremation, some items may have to be removed before the cremation takes place, as some materials cannot be cremated. We will advise you about this.

Religious and Cultural Requirements

Every coffin has a nameplate. If you want any religious or other symbols on the coffin we have a wide range available, including Asian and non-Christian symbols. We have cords and tassels for traditional Scottish funerals.

Care of the Ashes

After a cremation you will need to decide the final resting place of the ashes. You can keep the ashes in an urn, scatter them or bury them. You don't need to make a decision straightaway.

If you would like to place the ashes in an urn, we have a range of urns and ashes caskets which are shown in this brochure. We can help and advise you.

Memorials

Memorials are a way to remember our loved ones and can range from headstones at a grave to a simple flower in a garden of remembrance. Memorials provide comfort for many people, giving them a place to visit to remember the person who has died.

When choosing a memorial it is important that you have time to reflect on your decision and understand the different regulations that may affect your choice. We can help you with your choice of memorial after the funeral.

Finished in a light gloss oak effect with decorative side panels and a white taffeta interior.



The Priory Coffin

Finished in a light oak satin veneer with brass effect handles and white satin interior.



The Balmoral Coffin

Finished in an oak veneer with moulded panel lid, solid wood handles and brass effect fittings with a white quilted satin interior.

The Cathedral Coffin

Finished in a gloss mahogany veneer with engraved panels, distinctive solid wood and silver effect fittings with a white quilted satin interior.



The Sentinel Casket

Finished in a gloss oak veneer with panelled sides, eight swing bar handles and a hinged lid with a white quilted satin interior.



The Traditional Coffin

Made in solid oak with double panels and raised lid, brass effect metal handles with a satin interior and an extra deep frill.
A version of this coffin is available for cremation.

The Opal Coffin

Made in solid oak with a high gloss finish, this coffin has six antiqued bronze effect cast metal handles and a tufted superior satin interior suite, with lace edging. It may not be suitable for cremation.



The Royale Coffin

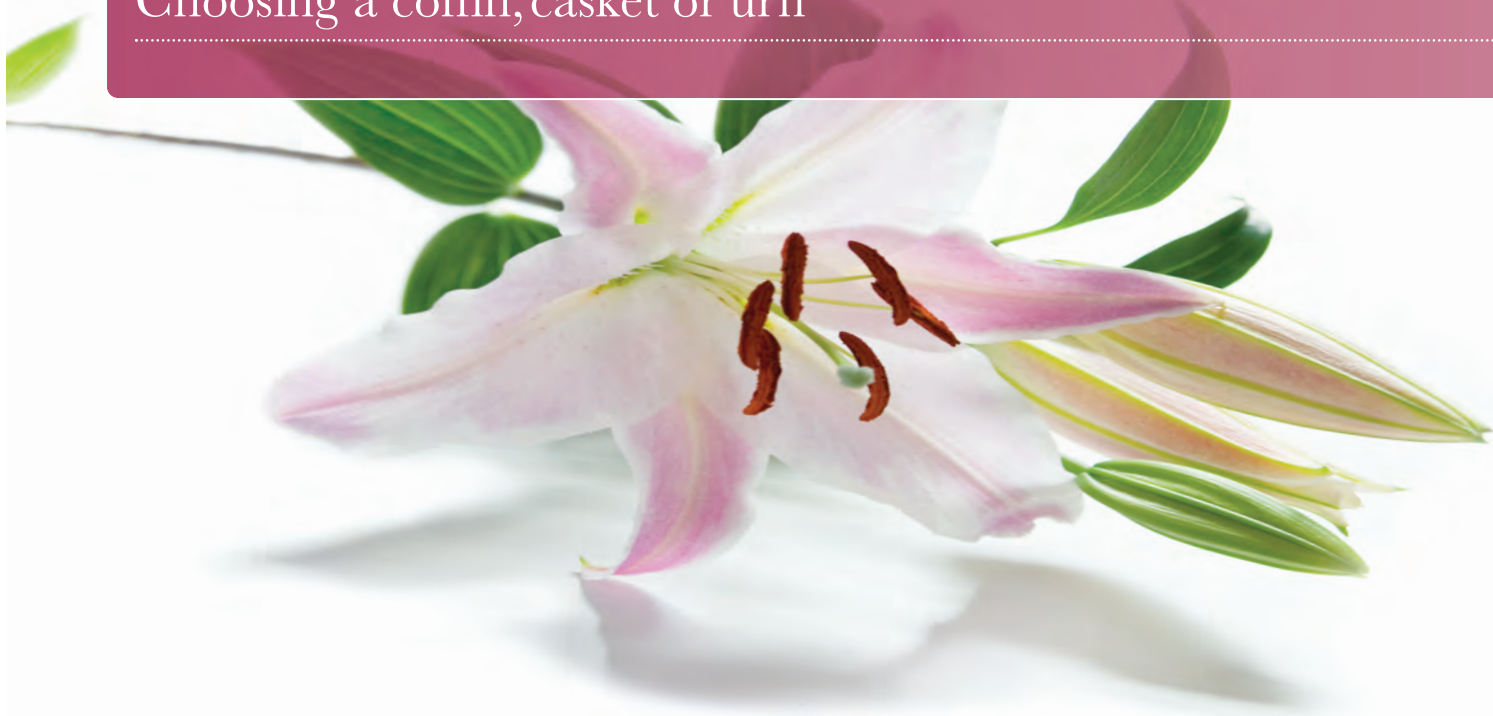
Made in fine solid oak with a hand polished finish, this coffin has antiqued brass finish handles and a tufted superior satin interior suite, with lace edging.



The Last Supper Coffin

A solid wood construction with moulded panels depicting The Last Supper. It has cast metal handles and a tufted superior satin interior suite, with lace edging. It may not be suitable for cremation.

The Sapphire Coffin

A solid hardwood construction with a high gloss mahogany finish. This coffin has six antiqued bronze handles and a tufted superior satin interior suite, with lace edging. It may not be suitable for cremation.



The Autumn Oak Casket

A solid oak construction with an Autumn oak satin finish. The coffin has wooden swing bar handles with a rosetan crepe interior. It may not be suitable for cremation.



Metal Casket

Metal caskets are also available. For more information on them, please ask our arranger. This casket is not suitable for cremation or certain cemeteries.



After a cremation

After a cremation you will need to decide the final resting place of the ashes. You can keep the ashes in an urn, scatter them or bury them. You don't need to make a decision straightaway.

If you would like to place the ashes in an urn, we have a range of urns and ashes caskets which are shown overleaf.
